The GLMS robotics group participated in the Consumers Energy Robotics Day on Friday, February 23. Our students were met at the event with hot chocolate being made in the hood-trunk of an Ford F-150 Lightning. Once inside, we set up our table to display our robot, trophies, engineering notebook, and our tri-board. The students had time to explore the event, learning about how electricity is sent to their homes through power lines and how voltage is controlled to protect all of the electrical devices we use every day. The students explored other uses of robotics, controlled Spot the Dog (used to detect hot spots in substations), flew a drone (used for inspecting power lines), and learned how in-line inspection tools keep gas lines safe.
